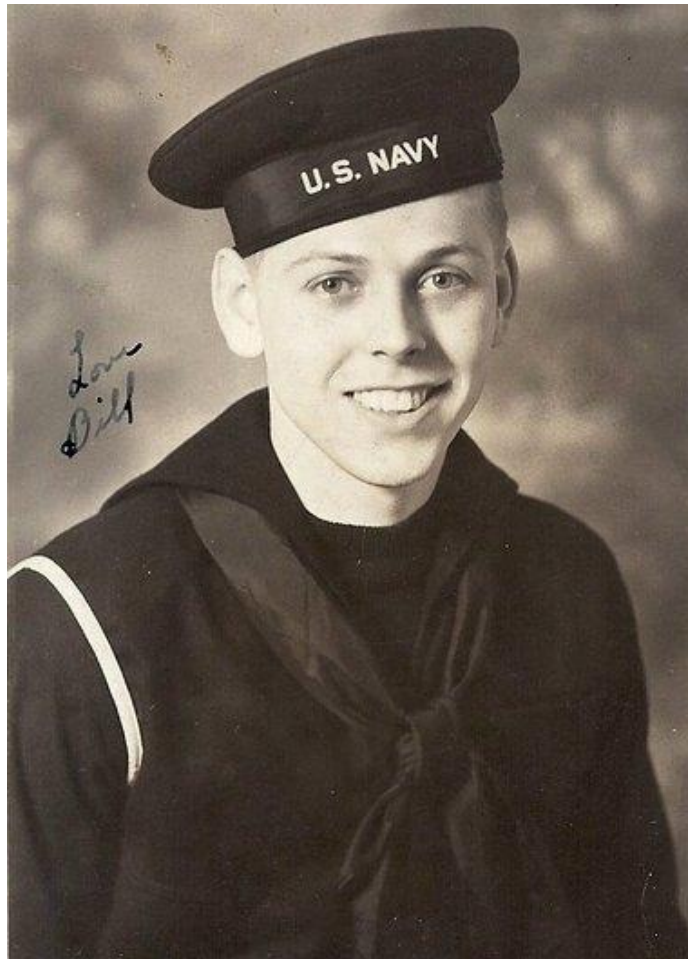

VAN HOUTEN – CARR

The wedding took place at Cardiff recently between **Mr Raymond John Van Houten**, only son of Mr and Mrs J. A. Van Houten, Paterson, New Jersey, and **Betty Aline Carr**, younger daughter of Mr and Mrs G. J. Aline, Dock View Road, Barry Dock

Mr Van Houten is a war department civilian employed by the US Army and was stationed at Barry during the war, with the US Army. Mrs Van Houten is the daughter of Madam Aline, a well-known figure in Barry for her charitable work.

Interesting!

Clearly, Mr Van Houten was a civilian and not a GI. But, he **was** employed by the US War Department **and**, most significantly, he would not have met Betty if it had not been for the War! So I am very happy to classify Mrs Van Houten as an American War Bride. I assume that they lived in the USA after the war...

[According to Mrs Dorothy Rees, 22-11-2008, Audrey and Claudius had four children. **The first was Robert. The others were Claudia, Sharon and Barry.**]

Thursday August 6th, 1953

BARRIANS MEET IN UNITED STATES

Mrs A C Bumford, of 66, Porth-y-Castell ... While on tour she paid a visit to several former Barry girls, including Mrs J Cook, daughter of Mr and Mrs W Jenkins, 28 Porth-y-Castell, and **Mrs Conrad** and her sister Gwyneth, of Richmond, Virginia, daughters of Mr and Mrs Williams, 23, Tan-y-Fron, and their American husbands and families.

"They seemed exceptionally happy there, said Mrs Bumford, "although they were very interested in any news of Barry." While in Minneapolis she saw General Eisenhower...

Mrs Bumford's visit to America is also referred to in a letter received by the "Barry and District News" last week from Mrs Conrad. In her letter Mrs Conrad states: "Mrs Bumford made a special journey to visit my sister and I here in Richmond, Virginia. What a wonderful thing it was for us two girls to have an old Barrian coming to see us.

"In spite of our very happy marriages and lovely children Barry will never be out of our hearts. How we long to walk to Cold Knapp when the temperature soars to 100. I have yet to come across anything that beats our Welsh beauty spot.

"Daddy sends us the "Barry and District News" regularly and I read everything – even the advertisements!"

Mrs Carolyn Peterson (daughter of Marjorie Hoffenbecker/Seymour, see Issue 4,)

wrote me:

Re: British Brides:

'My mother belonged to a club of women called "**British Brides**" who -- oddly -- lived in and around **Marquette, Michigan**. I say oddly as Marquette was a remote small town and it seemed odd to have so many British Brides who landed in such a backwater place. There were quite a few of them that I can recall, probably 10-15, who arrived in various ways, but mostly due to the war. They would take turns getting together in each other's homes for dinner and chatter and gales of laughter into the evening. I know it was a great source of enjoyment and comfort to my mother, as I'm sure it was for the other "brides."

Next month we broaden our horizons to consider **South Wales GI Brides**... Mrs Frances Spencer (below) was born in Penarth, near Cardiff but lives in Washington State... the photo was taken in 2006...
